Howard Brod Brownstein, CTP, exemplifies the corporate renewal professional who complements professional pursuits with volunteer work. He is currently a member of TMA's Board of Directors and in his second term as one of the few at-large members of its Executive Committee.

During all his terms as a member of TMA's Board and Executive Committee, Brownstein has had a nearly perfect attendance record. He was named to TMA's Audit Committee in 2005 and will serve as the Committee's chair in 2007. In 2006, he served on the Board of Directors of the Association of Certified Turnaround Professionals (ACTP) as its Vice President for International Affairs.

In addition to his various TMA leadership roles, Brownstein has also:

- led the effort to establish the TMA Japan Chapter—currently with more than 130 members—and continues to assist TMA Japan in its efforts to develop what will soon be the first non-U.S. Certified Turnaround Professional program.
- led the effort to revamp ACTP's policies, procedures, and the license agreement for establishing international affiliates. In addition to the Japanese certification program, he is assisting the United Kingdom Chapter with its CTP programs. Brownstein strongly believes that the CTP program is the key to TMA's realization of its mission to be the world's premier organization dedicated to corporate renewal.

- as a member of TMA's International Committee, traveled to Austria and the Czech Republic at his own expense to help develop TMA chapters in those countries.
- conceived of and proposed the "TMA Ambassadors" program, whereby TMA members who travel abroad are encouraged, under the supervision of TMA staff, to make contact with existing and prospective TMA chapters and receive recognition for these efforts.
- co-chaired the 2006 TMA Annual Convention and was program co-chair for previous annual conventions in San Francisco and Baltimore, organizing many panels on such diverse topics as health care industry turnarounds and advising family businesses; has moderated or participated in a panel at nearly every year's annual convention.

For several years, Brownstein served on the Editorial Advisory Board of *The Journal of Corporate Renewal*. He served as guest editor of an issue each year, obtaining and contributing more than 30 articles on wide-ranging themes.

Brownstein led the Cornerstone Program during 2000 and 2001. (NachmanHaysBrownstein, Inc. is a Cornerstone "Sustaining Donor" and is also a Cornerstone 15 Campaign donor.)
